## Shoshone National Forest releases Travel Management Preliminary Environmental Assessment

**Cody, Wyo., July 30, 2020** – The Shoshone National Forest has moved into the next phase of the Travel Management Planning process for motorized use with the release of the Preliminary Environmental Assessment. With the release of this assessment and all associated documents today, a 30-day public comment period has also begun.
